ACTIVITIES

SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY

A large part of the After-School All-Stars experience is equipping our students with the hi-tech skills to compete in the 21st century. The ladies of Coretta Scott King Young Women's Leadership Academy took part in a technology class, taught by an instructor from Georgia Perimeter College, that taught them how to determine the quality of shampoo by putting drops in test tubes and measuring retention of suds after adding water. Likewise, they went on a field trip to JA Biztown to learn how companies recycle products and design buildings, in partnership with Georgia Tech's STEMinist project. The boys at BEST Academy participated in the robotics enrichment, the Stallions of Sandy Spring Middle School exercised their minds by performing experiments through the Science Explorers Club, and the musicians of Brown Middle School learned how to use sound equipment to record music through Music Production 101. These activities have been great for helping our students exercise their scientific and tech-savvy minds.

Athletics and nutrition are key program components of After-School All-Stars. In addition, the Stallions of Sandy Springs Middle School participated in martial arts and step team. All our sites have been learning how to prepare tasty and healthy cuisines in their nutrition classes. We are so happy that the students at our sites have the chance to take part in these nutrition and physical activity programs.

We have been growing exponentially over the years, and this year has been no exception. After-School All-Stars would like to welcome Atlanta Mission as the newest site on our roster of after-school sites. We are working with My Sister's House, Atlanta Mission Women's and Children's division, which has a 264 bed facility that offers overnight shelter and residential programs for homeless women and women with children. Also, one of our newest partners is Atlanta Community Food Bank, an organization that delivers over 45 million pounds of food and groceries each year and distributes it to more than 600 nonprofit partner agencies serving families and individuals in 29 metro Atlanta and North Georgia counties. Atlanta Community Food Bank has been generously donating nonperishable food items our programs. We are grateful to include these two organizations to our family, and we look forward to a long and fruitful relationship.
